1. GOD'S WORD IS THE ONLY SOURCE OF AUTHORITY.

"You nullify the word of God by your tradition..." Mk 7:13

2. FOLLOW THE LITERAL INTERPRETATION,

UNLESS SCRIPTURE COMPELS OTHERWISE.

"I AM the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" Matt 22:32

3. ACCEPT SCRIPTURE AS TRUE.

"The Scriptures must be fulfilled." Mark 14:49

"Not the smallest letter... will pass from the law..." Matt 4:18

4. ACCEPT SCRIPTURE AS INSPIRED, WRITTEN BY THOSE IT SAYS DID.

"David, speaking by the Spirit,..." Matt 22:43

"Moses... wrote about Me." John 5:46-47

5. INTERPRET SCRIPTURE WITH SCRIPTURE.

"It is also written..." Matt 4:7

6. DON'T LET ONE PASSAGE NULLIFY ANOTHER.

"If then David calls him 'Lord', how can he be his son?" Mat 22:45

7. GO TO PASSAGES THAT WERE INTENDED

TO ANSWER YOUR QUESTION.

"Haven't you read...?" (the passage that relates?) Matt 19:4

8. KEEP IT IN CONTEXT.

"Moses permitted you..." Matt. 19:8
